But it's largely repetitive of their past work. Of course that's what Pillar followers want.

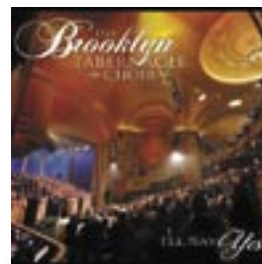
Heart-on-your sleeve is just kind of a prereq for the Christian artist. But Sevenglory have done extra credit. This band of four PKs sing songs that are

blithe about popularity and concerned with pointing the listener's heart to the Cross. And they do it in a slightly quirky, guitar pop manner that will grab the attention of your under-20s.

The poppy, pseudo punk-pop, tune "Let It Be Love" adds "cool" to the list in 1 Corinthians: speaking in tongues, the gift of prophecy, faith that can move mountains, giving all our possessions to the poor and surrendering our bodies to the flames: even if I'm "cool" and we don't have love it doesn't mean a thing. Which is actually a language that your junior high and early high school groups can grab. It hints of the fact that the lyrics would fit better in a 101 class rather than a 301; nevertheless, it fills is a need. And the fact that it's all couched in guitar rock with a heart on ministry, makes this a good start for Sevenglory.

Since their 1996 debut, Avalon has been known for delivering a successful mix of pop vocals and dynamic production arrangements. Although all 15 songs on *Another Time, Another Place* are covered worship classics, Avalon's stunning vocals, strong production and trademark harmonies offer a refreshing spin to these

familiar Christian classics. Avid Avalon followers know they have had quite a few lineup changes over the years, and this time is no different. Since their 2006 release, *Stand*, vocalist Jeremy Richardson is the newest member of the popular foursome, replacing Jody McBrayer to join Greg and Janna Long and Melissa Thompson.

This time around Avalon has set out to take their adult contemporary sound and pay tribute to the faith-based landmark Christian songs of the 1970s, 80s and 90s. It might not appear an extremely ambitious endeavor, yet Avalon is able to successfully make these songs their own, reminding us why these classics are part of the worship hall-of-fame in the first place. Worship anthems as "God is in Control" and "People Get Ready" re-ignite one's passion and enthusiasm for songs that mark many people's personal and congregational transformations.

With stunning vocals comparable to Point of Grace and Selah, Avalon's rich, soulful pop sound give songs like Amy Grant's "El Shaddai" and "Thy Word,"

and Michael W. Smith's "Place in This World" a different coat of paint—not that they need them, but the change redefines the array of stellar worship projects that have been released over the decades. Although some might think Avalon has taken on a monster they just can't tackle by trying to cover the likes of Steven Curtis Chapman and The Imperials, their timeless sound pulls it off and proves that Avalon possesses enduring talent.
